

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Technical requirements of the program

Sky Calendar is designed for Windows 8.1, Windows 10, or Windows 11 operating systems.


In order for all program controls to be available and visible, it is necessary to have a monitor with a resolution of at least 1000 pixels in height.

License Terms

- The Sky Calendar program is protected by copyright.
- It is forbidden to modify or decompile it in any way.
- The licensed version of the Program can be installed by the User on up to three different devices, as long as these devices are owned by the Licensee.
- It is forbidden to disclose or hand over to anyone the registration data (name and password), which is used to "unlock" the program from the trial version to the full version.
- The program is distributed as shareware, i.e. everyone has the opportunity to download it from the Internet for free before purchasing it, install it on their own computer and test it thoroughly. By purchasing the program, the user shows that he or she accepts the program as it is.

A few quick introductory tips and information

- As you can see, the main window of the program is divided into three parts: In the middle, largest part, the horoscope itself is drawn, to the right of it there is a panel with various controls related to the currently opened horoscope, and to the left there is a panel with buttons for launching other functions accessible for the given type of horoscope (native, partner and transit).
- Whenever you start the Sky Calendar, the horoscope for the current moment is displayed first. In order to see the horoscope for the place where you are currently (your home), you must first select this place in the panel on the right (and if it is not in the list, you can add it by clicking on the **Database of places** button). The program will remember it and at any time next time it will show you the horoscope for the current time and your currently set home.
- If you want to view a person's native horoscope (i.e., birth chart), click on the Native tab in the left or right panel.
- Note that in the panel to the right of the horoscope you can easily change e.g. time, date or place of birth and that these changes are immediately reflected in the chart drawing. We think you might find it useful.
- Also notice the **Draw Houses** and **Draw Aspects** radio buttons in the same panel, which will help you view the horoscope in a way that is clear to you at the moment and for the given purposes. As far as aspects are concerned, even if you turn off their plotting in the horoscope, the aspects of a particular object will be displayed when you move the mouse cursor over this object (unless you have this function turned off see Settings and then Plotting the horoscope). If you turn on the **Include aspects to houses** switch, both aspects with house spikes are rendered while the **Draw aspects** with house spikes checkbox is selected.



Important are the buttons Selection of **Aspects** and Objects selecting (we are still in the panel on the right), where you can turn on or off the display of objects (planets, etc.) and

aspects for individual types of horoscopes. Only the aspects and objects checked here will be drawn in the current horoscope. You can turn on as many objects as you want, but if you turn on too many of them for display, it may happen that they simply do not fit into the horoscope drawing. In this case, the **Undisplayed Objects** button will appear at the bottom of the left panel – if you click on it, you will get a list of objects that could not be drawn in the horoscope (and the reason why this is the case will be given here).

In the selection of aspects, you also have the option to completely disable or re-



enable any aspect by clicking on the **Disable** / **Enable** button (the disabled aspect will be grayed out in the list). Such an aspect will then not be counted at all (in short, it will cease to exist for the program), which is particularly important for the elimination of so-called overlapping aspects, i.e. aspects whose size is close to each other (e.g. the sextile is 60° and

the septile is 51°), so when the maximum orbis are set too large (see the **Orbis Settings** chapter), a situation may arise when both aspects are valid for some two objects from the horoscope at the same time (in our case, these two objects can be in sextile and septile at the same time). – We deal with this problem in more detail in the chapter **Aspect analysis**, at the moment we will just write that we recommend disabling all aspects that you do not use, as this will not only solve the already indicated problem, but also speed up the calculations, and thus the entire program.

- You can easily add a new person to the database by clicking on the Persons button and then on the Database of Persons to the right of the horoscope (we will talk about this in more detail below). But you can do the same thing even more easily: In the native horoscope, in the panel on the right of any person, change the name, date, time and place of birth to the dates of the person you want to add, and then tap the Persons again and then tap Save person as. And that's it. The new person is saved.
- To work with the database of persons, you will find 4 other options on the right panel under the **Persons** button:
 - 1. **Save person:** Use when, for example, you change a person's data (date, time, or place of birth) and you want to save the changed values.
 - 2. **Save person as:** Works similarly to the previous button, but the person will be saved as a new database entry (i.e., a new person).
 - 3. **Delete person:** Deletes the person from the database.
 - 4. **Database of persons:** Opens a separate window with a database of people see below.
- On the panel to the right of the horoscope, you will also find the Unknown birthdate. As its name suggests, check it if you don't know the person's time of birth (you only know the date). The program then removes from the horoscope all objects that are strongly dependent on the time of birth, i.e. those objects that circle the entire circle of the horoscope (360°) within 24 hours. These are houses, ASC, DCS, MC, IC, sensitive points, Vertex and Antivertex. The horoscope will then be calculated for noon local time. However, even with the rest of the objects, there may be some inaccuracy in the calculated position in this case, because each object shifts a little during the day. This is especially true of the Moon, which shifts by about 13° per day

(which means that its actual position at the time of birth, which we do not know, can be up to 6.5° different from the calculated position). For the Sun, Mercury and Venus, this deviation should not exceed 0.5°, for Mars about 0.25°, and for other objects it will be more or less negligible.



● Right-clicking on any object in the horoscope drawing will open a window with detailed information about this object. You will see information about its location, its aspects with other elements of the horoscope, as well as available interpretations of the constellations in which it is located, the symbolism of the degree (Sabian and Hindu symbols) and also the possibility to insert a text note to the displayed object. Most of the terms you may encounter in this window are explained in the chapter Table of Positions (see

below), in addition to the distance from the Sun and the distance from the Earth for the planets. Distances are expressed in astronomical units (AU), only for the Moon in kilometres.

By clicking on the **Analysis** button, it is possible to display a detailed graphical analysis of selected aspects (we will cover this topic later in a separate chapter). The letter **A** indicated by the aspect means that it is an **applying aspect**, the letter **S** means that it is a **separating aspect**.

- Range of calculations: The Sky calendar calculates horoscopes for dates from 1601 to 3000, excluding Pluto and asteroids: It calculates the position of Pluto only for the years 1800 to 2100 and the position of asteroids from 1900 to 2100.
- Accuracy of position calculations: With the exception of asteroids, the error in the calculations of the positions of all other objects should not exceed 0.5. The positions of asteroids are most accurately calculated roughly for the period from 1970 to 2030, outside this period there may be some inaccuracies, which are difficult to quantify.


Database of persons

As we mentioned in the previous chapter, a new person can be saved to the program very quickly and easily by changing the data (date, time of birth, etc.) of any person in the right panel to the data of the new person in the native horoscope and then tapping on **Save person as** in the same panel in the **Persons** section.

You can also correct data about an already saved person just as quickly and easily, only instead of the **Save person as** button, you will use the **Save person** button.

However, both of these operations can also be performed in a separate window, which you can open from the right panel by clicking on the **Persons** button and then **Database of persons**.

The window looks like this:



First, click on the **New Person** button and enter the **person's name**.

The date of birth can range from 1601 to 3000 (in the trial version, however, the program only works with dates between 2010 and 2030). If you enter a date in the Julian calendar, clicking on the **Gregorian** button will convert this date to the date of the Gregorian calendar. The conversion must be done right now because the program in any other part considers each date to be the date of the Gregorian calendar. However, if you enter the date of the Gregorian calendar (probably almost always, with the possible exception of some "historical" dates), then of course you don't have to pay attention to this button at all.

If you know the **time of birth** of the person you are entering, enter it as accurately as possible. This figure is important for calculating the positions of houses, ASC, MC, DSC, IC,

Vertex and sensitive points, and it is also of considerable importance for calculating the positions of fast-moving planets (especially the Moon). If you don't know your time of birth, select **Unknown birthdate**. The horoscope of such a person will then be calculated without objects "sensitive" to time (see the previous chapter).

Next, select **your Place of Birth** (you can search for it using the box located below the list of places). If you do not find the desired place in the list, you can add it by clicking on the **Places** button, which opens a window with a database of places (see below).

As we have already mentioned, **the time zone is** set automatically by the program. However, if you do not agree with the programme's suggested value, you can check or correct the information by clicking on the **Countries** button. Then a new window will open with a database of states and time changes, to which we also devote a separate chapter.

Don't forget to Save the person.


On the **Note** tab, you can insert a text note for the selected person.

On the **Events** tab, it is possible to save any life events of the selected person (wedding, injury, win, etc.) You set the name of the event, the date, time, and the place when and where it occurred, and save the entry. These events can then be depicted in the person's transit horoscope (see below in a separate chapter dedicated to transits). The function of the two buttons (Gregorian and Countries) located on this tab is exactly the same as that of the same buttons described above.


Location database

You can open the window for entering or correcting places by clicking on the **Database of places** button on the right panel of the main program window, or by clicking on the arrow next to the **Setup** button, which can be found in the top menu (above the horoscope).

The window looks like this:



If your computer is connected to the Internet, a map of the selected location will appear on the right side of the window (and if you're connected to the Internet and still don't see the map, check to see if the Firewall is blocking the Sky Calendar). Entering (or correcting) the location can then be completely done using this map, otherwise everything must be entered manually. Let's first describe the first, more pleasant option:



If you want to add a new location to the database, first search for it on the map. The easiest way to do this is to use the box located above the map, where you enter the name of the desired place, or to specify the state or street (if you know one that is located in the city). Quite often, however, it is enough to just enter the name. The location will then be displayed on the map. By clicking on the map at the "right position", another window will appear with information about the selected location. If everything is correct, you can then save the selected location as a new location or overwrite the location selected in the database.

In most cases, the program will find out everything you need (name, geographical coordinates and the state and the time zone associated with it), only rarely will it be able to identify some of them correctly (e.g. a country when you select a location located outside the borders of all countries – for example, the ocean). In this case, you will need to fill in the missing information manually.

To **fix a location**, follow the same procedure: Search for the location in the list located on the left side of the window, then click on the map where the selected location is actually located. You can then save everything by clicking on the **Overwrite the selected place** button.


If you do not see the map, you need to do the whole task manually, i.e. enter the name of the place, its geographical coordinates and assign it to the correct country. The latitude of places in the Southern Hemisphere is entered as a negative number, and the longitude of a place in the Western Hemisphere is entered as a negative number. Otherwise, the numbers are positive.

The database of places is closely related to the database of states, which we will deal with in the next chapter.

Database of States and Time Changes

To open this database, click on the arrow next to the **Setup** button (which can be found in the top bar of the main program window) and then click on **States and time change**. Here you can edit data about individual countries and time changes (typically summertime) that have been introduced in their territory. Standard (normal) zone times are listed for each country. Those countries that are spread over multiple time zones are stored in the database in multiple rows, depending on the number of time zones. This is necessary so that each location can be assigned to the correct zone time.

Zone time is expressed as the time difference from Universal Time, which is abbreviated UT (Universal Time). For example, in Spain, this shift is plus one hour, which is usually written as UT+1 or UTC+1. During summertime, the shift is always one hour higher, i.e. in the Spain it is UT+2.



For each country, the following data are given: On the one hand, it is a two-digit country code according to ISO 3166-1, and on the other hand, a switch determines whether the start and end of daylight-saving time is calculated in the selected country according to the algorithm used in the EU. For such countries, daylight saving times can be entered in bulk in the Sky Calendar (see below). We do not recommend changing country codes for no reason, and we also do not recommend deleting individual states and territories from the

database. The program could then have a problem assigning locations to the correct country and thus to the correct time zone (and thus this assignment would have to be done manually).

Individual time changes (daylight saving time, but not only those) are entered on the **Time change** tab. The Sky calendar contains a database of time changes for almost all European countries from 1916 to 2023. You can save other changes, for the following years or other countries, to the program yourself.

If you would like to store **EU Daylight Saving Time**, the process is quite simple: First, search for the country you want, then on the Time Changes tab, set the year for which you want to save the daylight-saving times, and click **Set the summertime according to EU directive**. If you leave the **Set for each country under this directive** checkbox checked, then the changes will be automatically saved for all other EU countries (see above). And to confirm everything, click on the **Save** button.


In other cases, after selecting the country and year, it is still necessary to choose what type of changes you want to save, i.e. whether it is a change that was valid for the whole year, or a change that was valid for part of the year, or even two changes within one year (this also happens). You then set the start and end of the change or changes (if the change is not valid for the whole year) and the time offset (from Universal Time) that was in effect for the duration of the change. And confirm everything again with the **Save** button.

Orbis settings

Orbis determines the tolerance within which a given aspect can be considered valid. The size of the orbis depends on the importance of the aspect as well as the importance of the planets involved. For example, if an orbis of 10° is set for the square (i.e. an angle of 90°) between the Sun and the Moon, it means that this square will be valid if the two planets are angular from 80° to 100° in an angular position relative to each other.

You can set the size of the orbis using the **Orbis Settings** function. You can find it by clicking on the arrow next to the **Setup** button, which is located on the top bar of the main program window.

First, select the aspect whose orbis you want to change at the top left. Orbis can be set separately for basic aspects (conjunction, sextile, quadrature, trine and opposition), for all other aspects the orbis are set the same (they are listed as other aspects). Subsequently, in the table, you set the values of the orbis for the relative position of two objects and the selected aspect according to your habits. The maximum allowed size of the orbis is 12°.




The values from the table will be used for native, partner and transit horoscopes. However, since partner and transit charts usually use smaller orbis than native charts, their size for these two types of horoscopes can be reduced using the sliders located above the table. In practice, this means that if, for example, the orbis is set to 8° for some two objects and some aspect in the table and 50% of this value is set for the partner horoscope, the orbis will be 8° valid for the native horoscope, but 4° for the partner horoscope (and analogously the same applies to the transit horoscope, for example 40% the orbis will be 3.2°).

In addition, in the upper part of the window, you can also set the orbis for declension and width aspects (i.e. for parallels and counterparallels). The orbis value set here applies to declination aspects, for width aspects half the value will be considered valid.

Program settings

To open the settings, click on the **Setup** button in the top bar of the main window (above the horoscope). The whole setup is divided into several tabs:

Program tab:



Language: Choose between Czech, Slovak, and English.

Appearance: Allows you to choose one of several possible program skins. The selected appearance is applied to the program immediately, but some details may not be reflected until the program is restarted.

Make daily backup database:

Checking this radio button causes Sky Calendar to back up database files every day that it is running. These files will be stored in the **BackDay folder** (a subfolder of the folder where you have Sky Calendar installed) and the date of the backup will be added to their names. These files are: personal.dbm, texty.dbm, program.dbm, lunar.dbm, kelt.dbm and color.dbm. So, for example, if they were backed up on 21/06/2023, they will be backed up as: persona2023_6_21.dbm, texty2023_6_21.dbm, program2023_6_21.dbm, lunar2023_6_21.dbm, kelt2023_6_21.dbm and color2023_6_21.dbm. Therefore, if it is necessary to restore the program (or its databases) to a certain date for any reason, it is necessary to search for the backed-up database files (in the BackDay folder) by name, rename them to their original names (i.e. remove the date from their name) and copy them to the folder where you have the Sky Calendar installed.

Delete backups older than ...: Backup database files older than the specified number of days will be deleted by the program.

Tabbed: Places the tabs of the right and left panels of the main program window either at the top or to the side.

Data conversion from version 4 of the1Sky Calendar: Opens a window where users of the previous version 4 of Sky Calendar can convert their dates (persons, interpretations) to this version.

Astrology Tab



Ecliptic longitude regardless a sign: If you check, the position (longitude) of objects will be given in degrees (from 0° to 360°) without distinguishing the sign. E.g.: 288° instead of 18 KO 00 (=18° Capricorn).

Convert degrees to decimal: When checked, quantities expressed in degrees will be given as a decimal number (e.g.

36.75°), otherwise in degree-minute format (36° 45').

Consider day and night when computing Arabian parts: If you turn on this switch, the program will use different formulas for day and night births to calculate the position of sensitive points. With the switch turned off, the daytime spawn formulas will be used to calculate points even in night spawns.

Sign Rulers: Here you can set the rulers of each sign (if you don't agree with the default settings).

Horoscope orientation: Choose whether the horoscope should be oriented along the horizontal axis of ASC – DSC or along the axis of Aries – Libra.

Preferred Home System: Select your favourite home system here. This system will be taken as the default. In a particular horoscope, you will always have the option to display houses of a system other than the one set here (on the panel to the right of the horoscope).


Because some house systems cannot be used for locations beyond the Arctic Circles where the Sun does not set or rise for a certain part of the year, select the system you want to use for these locations in the next list.

Sideric Horoscope: If you turn on this switch, the sidereal horoscope will be calculated, otherwise the tropical horoscope will be calculated. In the case of the sidereal horoscope, it is also possible to set the year when the spring point was located at 0° Aries. The prevailing opinion is that this happened in the year 221. This year (or, more precisely, on the day of the vernal equinox of this year), the sidereal and tropical horoscopes were identical. In other years, the two horoscopes differ from each other by the value of the precession (i.e. the shift of the spring point) that has been reached since that year. In astrology, this shift is most often called **ayanamsa** (the term comes from Indian astrology) and de facto expresses the angle by which the individual objects of the sidereal horoscope are shifted compared to their position in the tropical horoscope.

Chart drawing tab

Since all the settings listed here are immediately applied when changed, so that their effect is immediately visible, we will mention only three brief notes here:

- 1. Render aspects under the mouse: Checking this check will cause the hovering of the mouse cursor over any object to render aspects of that object with other objects.
- 2. Line thickness according to the accuracy of the aspect: When checked, the more accurate aspects in the horoscope will be drawn with a thicker line than the less accurate aspects.
- 3. **Mouse only:** When checked, the effect will only take effect when you hover the mouse over an object in the horoscope.



Color Setting tab

In this section, you can completely adjust the colors of your horoscope. All changes will be immediately reflected in the horoscope drawing, so we believe that there is no need for a detailed description of the individual settings, because everything will be immediately obvious.


In the upper part, you first select for which part of the horoscope you want to set the colors.

Then, in the list on the left, select the element whose colors you want to change, and then select the colors on the right.

If you want to save your color settings for later use, click **Save**. The settings will be saved under the name you enter in the field above the button. If you use an existing name, the original setting with the same name is overwritten, otherwise the settings are saved as new.

Use the **Choose** button to activate any of the settings you have already saved. **CAUTION:** Selecting one of the already saved settings will irretrievably cancel the current color settings. So, if you want to keep them in the future, don't forget to save the colors before you choose them.

You can then use the **Delete** button to remove any setting from the list.



Fonts tab

Here you can set fonts for text editors.

Native Horoscope (Birth Chart)

Since the actual work with the horoscope and the description of the controls located on the panel to the right of the horoscope has already been described in the previous text (especially in the first chapter), in this chapter we focus mainly on the functions that are available from the menu located on the panel to the left of the horoscope, in the Native Horoscope section.

Table of Positions

It shows, in the form of tables, the position and other data about individual objects from the horoscope just displayed. For each table, you can choose whether you want to display only the positions of the objects drawn in the horoscope or the positions of all objects. In the Planets and Planets tables, in addition to the position of each object (longitude, latitude, declination) it is also indicated:



Direction: An arrow pointing to the right indicates the direction of movement in a straight line (counterclockwise), an arrow pointing to the opposite arrow indicates a backward direction (retrograde).

Speed: It is expressed as the ratio of actual speed to average speed. In the reverse movement, it is a negative number. A speed close to zero indicates that the object is close to a "stop", i.e. near the point at which it changes its direction (the exact time of the stop can be found in the ephemerides, which we will describe later). For asteroids, this figure is not calculated.

House: This column shows what kind of house the property is in. If the houses are not counted (at an unknown time of birth), this figure is of course not given.

Ruler: The ruler of the sign in which the object is located (see chapter Astrology Settings).

Power: Shows the power of an object relative to its position in the sign or part of it. The different types of these positions are given in abbreviations, the meaning of which is as follows:

- DOM: The planet is in its domicile (home, a sign that it rules itself), is a dispositor for itself.
- **DE**: The planet is in detriment (exile).
- **ELE**: The Planet is elevated (in exaltation).
- FALL: The planet is in the fall.
- **REC X**: The Planet is at the X planetary reception. This situation occurs when two planets are mutually in their signs (in the signs in which they rule). E.g. if the Sun is in the sign of the Libra and Venus in the Lion, then the Sun is in the reception with the Venus and Venus at the reception with the Sun, because the ruler of the Libra is Venus and the ruler of the Lion is the Sun (the program in this case write at the Sun *Rec Venus* and Venus *Rec Sun*).
- **TRI**: The planet is in the triplicity of its element.
- **FAC**: The planet is in its face.
- **TER**: The planet is in its term (borders).
- **DEC**: The planet is in its decan.
- PER: The planet is peregrinal when is "on the road".

Score: This is a number expressing the overall strength of the planet. The higher the number, the more qualitatively pure, stronger, and more positive the planet's influence is. When calculating the number of points, the following is taken into account:

- The position of the planet in the signs and its parts (see Strength).
- The distance of the planet from the Sun.
- The speed of the planet's motion.
- Motion of the planet in a straight or reverse direction.
- Placing the planet in one of the important houses.
- Aspects to Venus, Jupiter, the Ascension Node, Mars and Saturn.

The **table of houses** shows the location of each house, the ruler of the sign in which each house is located, and the location of the ruler in the houses.

And similarly in other tables ...

All tables can be saved in PDF or XLS (Excel) format.

If you click on the **All in one** button, you will see a table containing all relevant data about all objects whose locations the Sky Calendar can calculate.

Table of Aspects

It displays a table of aspects between planets and other horoscope objects. In the table, you can choose whether only aspects with objects drawn in the horoscope or aspects with all objects will be listed. You can also choose whether to list only the aspects used in the drawing or all aspects. The types of aspects are displayed by shortcuts, which you can read by clicking the **Legend** radio button.

The letter **A** indicated by the aspect means that it is an **applying aspect**, the letter **S** means that it is a **separating aspect**.

By clicking on the **Analysis** button, it is possible to display a detailed graphical analysis of selected aspects (we will cover this topic later in a separate chapter).

Like the previous tables, this one can be saved in PDF or XLS format.




Parallels and counterparallels

Displays a table with an overview of declension, width and counter-parallels. As with aspects, individual (counter)parallels are listed under abbreviations, the meaning of which can be read by clicking on the **Legend switch**.


Under the Graph tab, these (counter)parallels are then displayed graphically.

Again, the table can be saved in PDF or XLS format, the chart as an image in a JPG file.



Summary

The Summary window is divided into three tabs for native and "Here and now" horoscopes (only the first tab is accessible for partnership and transit horoscopes):



On the first one, called **Summary**, you will find the representation of the basic planets (Sun to Pluto) in the individual signs and houses divided according to their quality, element, etc.

Quality: Shows in the first row how many planets are represented in each zodiac sign, divided according to their quality. In the second row, analogously, the number of planets in the corresponding types of houses, and in the row, the last sum of both these numbers.

Element: Displays in the first row how many planets are represented in each zodiac sign, divided by element. In the second row, analogously, the number of planets in the corresponding types of houses, and in the row,

the last sum of both these numbers.

Signs: Shows the number of planets in positive and negative signs.

Houses: Displays the number of planets in the day and night houses, and in the next row the number of planets in the east and west houses.

Dominant features: A description of the basic characteristics of the horoscope owner derived from the number of cardinal planets in each "type" of signs and houses.


Note:

- 1. If a calculation of houses is not performed for a particular horoscope (at an unknown time of birth), only the representation of planets in signs is calculated.
- 2. The Sun and Moon are always counted twice due to their importance.



On the second tab, called **Detail**, for each object shown in the horoscope, its location in the different types of signs and houses is indicated in detail, as shown in the figure opposite.

And on the last card called **Power** you will find for all the basic planets (Sun to Pluto) information whether the planet is in a position in the horoscope that strengthens it and has a harmonious effect on it, or vice versa.



Domicile: A planet is in its domicile (its home), i.e., in the sign it rules. Such a position empowers the planet, is natural to it, and in it it can freely express all its qualities and inclinations.

Exaltation: although the planet is not in its domicile, it is in a position that is favourable to it. This position also strengthens the planet, for its position in the horoscope is in harmony with itself.

Element: The planet is in a sign ruled by an element that corresponds to its characteristic. Again, this is an auspicious position that strengthens the planet in question.

Decan: The planet is in its decan, which is again slightly favourable.

Face and **Border**: In both cases, it is the position of the planet in the horoscope that slightly strengthens it.

Fall: it is the opposite of Exaltation. The planet is in a sign that suppresses its nature, its spontaneity, and that harms it. It is an unfavourable position which weakens the planet greatly.

Exile: The planet is in the opposite sign of its domicile. In this case, although the planet remains strong, its manifestations are unnatural as it is influenced by the opposite sign. It is therefore an unfavourable position, though less than a fall.


Perigrinal: this is a planet that is not in any significant position that would in any way greatly enhance or detract from it. A planet in this position can act like a solitaire, going its own way regardless of "what others say".

One day

The function on the timeline will show what significant astrological events will occur on the selected day. Important astrological events include aspects and transitions of individual objects to another sign (in addition, sunrise, sunset and culmination of the Sun are depicted). Only those objects that are selected for plotting in each type of horoscope ("here and now", native or transit) are included in the calculation.

The timeline can be saved as an image in JPG format.





Finding a constellation

You can start the function by clicking on the **Find constellation** button, which is located on the panel to the left of the horoscope, in the Native Horoscope section.


With the help of this function, it is possible to find out the moment when the selected transiting planet will be in a certain relationship to an object from the basic (native) horoscope.

In addition, it is possible to calculate the moments of different types of revolutions as well as the calculation of fertile days using the method of MD. Jonas. We will deal with these in the next two chapters, here we will describe the part that is highlighted in the

picture with a red box:

First, select the transiting planet or asteroid from the list on the left. Then choose one of the following three options:

- 1. You want to find out when the chosen transiting planet will be in a certain aspect to an object from the basic horoscope: In this case, in the right part of the window, in the list called "in aspect", select the aspect and in the list "with native" select the desired object of the native horoscope.
- 2. You want to find out when the chosen transiting planet will be in one of the houses of the native chart: In this case, select the desired house in the "in the house" list.
- 3. You want to find out when the chosen transiting planet will be in a particular zodiac sign: Analogous to the previous case, in the list called "in sign", select the desired sign.



Finally, select the calculation period at the bottom and click **OK**. Keep in mind that if you choose a period that is too long, the calculation may take longer.

The result will be displayed in a table. **After clicking** on any of the table rows, the transit horoscope for the selected moment will be drawn in the main window of the program.


The Search for Revolutions

In general, in astrology, revolutions are meant to be constellations when a transiting planet gets into a significant aspect to the same planet of the natal chart. From the horoscope of the revolution, predictions are then made for the period from the moment of the revolution to the moment when a revolution of the same type occurs again. In practice, various types of solar and lunar revolutions are most often used:

- The solar revolution (solar return) is calculated at the moment when the Sun occupies the same position (same ecliptic longitude) as it had at the moment of birth of the examined person. He reaches such a position once a year, and it is always a time close to his birthday. With the help of the solar horoscope, one can estimate the most important events of the year, from birthday to birthday.
- The demisolar revolution is calculated at the moment when the transiting Sun finds itself in opposition to the native Sun. This type of revolution makes it possible to make predictions for a period of half a year.
- The Quartisolar Revolution is calculated for the moment when the transiting Sun squares the native Sun. This type of revolution provides predictions for a period of quarter years.
- The Lunar Revolution (lunar return) is calculated for the moment when the Moon reaches the same position as it was at the moment of birth. The lunar horoscope is valid for 27 days and the main theme of this period can be deduced from it.
- The demillunar revolution is counted for the moment when the transiting Moon comes into opposition to the native Moon. This type of horoscope is valid for about 14 days.
- The Quartillary Revolution is calculated for the moment when the transiting Moon squares the Natal Moon. This type of revolution provides forecasts for about one week.
- The soli-lunar revolution (synodic lunation) is calculated for the moment when the Moon is in the same phase (i.e., at the same angular distance from the Sun) as it was at the moment of birth. This type of revolution provides predictions for about 29 days.

To **calculate the moments of revolutions**, use the same function as described in the previous chapter. Only at the top of the window, select the revolution you are interested in. The next procedure is then identical.

Natural birth control method by MD. Eugen Jonas



The basis of this method is one seemingly simple statement: A woman is always fertile at the same time as the moon was at the moment of her birth. If you've read the previous chapter well, you already know that those moments of good fertility should be those of salt-lunar revolutions. But you don't have to worry too much about that, to calculate these moments, you just need to check the for computing of days of fertility switch in the constellation search window above), select the calculation period

and click OK. You will then find the result of the calculation in the table (see picture). Again, after clicking on any of the table rows, a transit horoscope will be generated for the selected moment. And finally, we would like to add that this calculation is only available for women's horoscopes, as it makes no sense for men.

And what can this calculation be used for? MD. Jonas cites the following three cases:

- 1. To calculate fertile days.
- 2. To calculate infertile days.
- 3. To choose the sex of the child.

Regardless of the purpose for which MD. Jonas's method is used, it is always necessary for the woman who chooses this method to keep a calendar in which she will record the following dates:

- Every 15th day from the start of menstrual bleeding. For example, if the bleeding occurred on January 1, then the 15th day is January 16. This day is referred to as a fully green day.
- 6 days before and after a fully green day. In total, this creates a block of 13 green days, of which the middle one is fully green.
- The day on which the moon will be in the same phase as it was at the time of the woman's birth. This day is referred to as full red and can be calculated using the Sky calendar as described above.
- 3 days before the full red day, so there is a block of 4 red days, the last of which is fully red.

So how do you go about using this theory? It depends, of course, on the purpose:

- 1. Calculation of fertile days: This calculation is especially intended for women who cannot get pregnant. According to the initial statement of MD. Jonah's theory, it is clear that a woman's egg will be best prepared for fertilization at the moment when the moon is in the same phase as it was at the moment of the woman's birth, and it is irrelevant what phase the menstrual cycle is in! However, since the sperm travels to the egg for approximately 12 to 24 hours, the sexual union itself should take place half to one day before the set moment, so that the fertilization itself takes place at the "right time". Therefore, it is not enough to know only the date of the red day, but it is also necessary to know the exact time. The probability of pregnancy (according to MD. Jonas) in this case is around 80%. However, the probability can be increased to almost 100% if the full green day overlaps with the full red day, or if the two days lie right next to each other. Unfortunately, there are not many such super suitable days.
- 2. Calculation of infertile days: The calculation is intended especially for those couples who do not want any more children. According to MD. Jonah's findings, a woman can get pregnant on any green or red day. Thus, sexual abstinence must be observed on these days. On other days, the probability of pregnancy is relatively low, reportedly only around 2%.
- 3. Choosing the sex of the child: It is necessary to state in advance that the sex of the first child cannot be chosen, because its sex is already determined by the moment of birth of the mother and cannot be changed (according to MD. Jonas). For other children, it is necessary to proceed as follows: To conceive a child, choose one of the moments according to point 1. If the Moon is in a positive sign at this time (Aries, Gemini, Leo, Libra, Sagittarius, Aquarius), a boy will be born, otherwise a girl will be born. However, in order to increase the probability that a child of the desired sex will be born, it is necessary to avoid such red days that lie on a green day, so a red day should not be a green day at the same time. Since the moment of fertilization of the egg can never be precisely determined, it is also good to avoid those red days in which the Moon lies on the border of two signs, because in such a case it is not certain in which sign the Moon will be at that moment when the egg receives its sperm.


Ephemeris



You can start this feature by clicking on the **Ephemeris**, which you will find on the panel to the left of the horoscope "for here and now".

It is possible to calculate either simple ephemeris or detailed ephemerides. In the case of the simple ones, you can select multiple objects (i.e. planets and asteroids) for the calculation, but only their length will be calculated. In the case of detailed ephemerides, only one object can selected, but larger number of parameters of their orbits will be calculated, including important constellations such as the transition of the selected object to another sign and, in the case of the Moon, the moments of its phases.

In both cases, in the list, select the object (or objects) for which you want to calculate the ephemeris, the calculation period, and click OK. The ephemeris will then be displayed in the form of a table supplemented with graphs showing the development of the selected figure, as can be seen in the following figure:




The calculations are made in zone time, which is taken from the just opened horoscope for now here. By clicking on the time, the horoscope for this moment will be displayed in the basic program window (in our picture it would be, for example, the transit of Mercury into Aquarius).

We will add a few brief notes to the ephemerides tables:

- In addition, objects that change their direction are given the moment of stopping, i.e. the moment when they change direction from direct to reverse or vice versa. And again, by clicking on this figure, the horoscope of this moment will be displayed.
- The indication of the direction of movement is given only for those objects that are subject to changes. For example, the lunar nodes always move in the reverse direction and other objects for which this information is not given in the table always move in the straight direction (e.g. the Sun and the Moon).
- For the Sun, there is no width (it is always zero).
- The distance is given in AU (astronomical units), only for the Moon in km (refers to detailed ephemerides).

Sun



You can find this feature in all types of horoscopes, except for the partner horoscope. The function displays basic data about the position of the Sun in the sky for the selected date, time and place. When the window is opened, the input data (i.e. date, time and place) are always taken from the currently displayed horoscope, but then it is possible to change them at will.

In the table on the left, you will find:

- Sunrise time on the selected day and place.
- The time of the **Sun's culmination** on the selected day and place (i.e., the time when the Sun reaches its highest position above the horizon on a given day and place).
- Sunset time on the selected day and place.
- The height of the Sun above the horizon at the moment of culmination, expressed in angular degrees.
- The length of the day on the selected day and place (expressed in hour:minute format).
- And the current height of the Sun above the horizon at the set day, place and time (again in angular degrees).

The table on the right shows the starting points of each type of dawn and the end of each type of twilight:

Civil twilight or dawn: Occurs when the centre of the Sun is between 0° and 6° below the horizon. During this time, you can perform normal work that requires daylight, and you can also read texts with small letters (if you have good eyesight, of course).

Nautical twilight or dawn: Occurs when the centre of the Sun is 6° to 12° below the horizon. During this time, the brightest stars appear in the sky and the contours of the landscape are still visible.

Astronomical twilight or dawn: Occurs when the centre of the Sun is 12° to 18° below the horizon. During this time, brighter stars can be seen in the sky (up to about fifth magnitude). After the end of astronomical twilight, true night begins and less bright stars appear in the sky.

In the lower part of the window, the daily movement of the Sun in the sky on the selected day and place and its current position at the selected time is graphically depicted. The vertical axis of the graph represents the height of the Sun above or below the horizon (negative values), and the horizontal axis represents the time expressed in hours (0 to 24). Different shades of grey are also used to highlight the different types of dawn and dusk.

Note: When calculating the times of sunrise and sunset shown in the table, the influence of the diffraction of light in the atmosphere, which causes the Sun to appear to rise a little earlier (and set a little later) before it actually rises above the horizon (or disappears behind it at sunset). However, this effect is not taken into account in the graph that plots the actual position of the Sun, which means that the data on sunrise and sunset between the table and the graph may differ by a few minutes. In short: The graph shows the actual position of the Sun, while in the table the times of sunrise and sunset are only apparent (but these "apparent" times are commonly given).

Synastry horoscope

To open your horoscope, click on **Synastry** Horoscope on the panel to the left or right of your horoscope.

By clicking on the field **Find a person**, you will first select the person you want to match with the person from the native horoscope. That person's horoscope will then be displayed on the outer edge of the horoscope wheel (the native first-person horoscope will remain inside the circle).

In the partner comparison, it is examined in particular in what mutual aspects the planets of both persons involved are and in which house of the first person (i.e. the person of the native horoscope) the planets of the second person are located. The answer to such an inquiry should be to find out how the second person fits in with the first person.

The controls and functions of all elements on the right panel are the same as in the native horoscope, but of course with the difference that now they concern the second person.

The offer of the Partner horoscope in the left panel is also similar to the offer of the Native horoscope, so we will point out only minor differences here:

Summary: It now shows the division of the planets into different groups of signs and houses of both the first (native) and second (partner) person. There are no dominant features, instead a percentage match is given (the closer to one hundred, the closer the two people should be).

Position tables: This is a table of the other person's object positions. The columns "In the house of nativity" indicate in which house of the first person the corresponding object of the second person is located.

Aspects: The table lists aspects of second-person objects with first-person objects. Otherwise, the options and controls of the table are the same as described in the native horoscope.

Toggle persons: Swaps the second person for the first person and vice versa.

The Sky calendar also allows the calculation of two special types of partner horoscopes, which we will now describe. The buttons for their calculation can be found in the panel to the left of the horoscope, in the Partner Horoscope section.

Composite and combined horoscope

Composite and combined horoscopes are one of the most frequently used techniques of comparative horoscopes, in addition to the classic partner horoscope, which we wrote about in the previous chapter.

The position of individual astrological objects **in a composite horoscope** is calculated as the arithmetic mean of the position of one and the same object in both horoscopes being compared. If, for example, it is The Sun in the first-person horoscope at 0° Taurus and the Sun in the second-person horoscope at 0° Leo, then its position in the resulting composite horoscope will be at 15° Gemini, because the following applies: $(30^{\circ}+120^{\circ})/2 = 75^{\circ} = 15^{\circ}$ Gemini.

The combined horoscope is calculated for the average values of the time and place (i.e. geographical location) of the birth of both partners.

Both of these types of horoscopes are used in the Sky Calendar in a similar way as the native horoscope, but with a few limitations:

- A combined horoscope cannot be saved (nor is there much reason to do so, as it can be easily recalculated at any time in the future).
- In the case of a composite horoscope, the limitations are even greater, because it places objects (planets, etc.) in positions that can never occur in reality (which follows from the principle of its calculation). Therefore, it is not possible to change the time or place of "birth" (simply because these data do not exist), nor the system of houses, nor can some other calculations be made (numerological, Chinese horoscope, transits, tattvas, ...)

To return to the regular native horoscope from both of these types of comparative horoscopes, click on the **Close combinations** (or **Close composite)** button, which will appear in the upper part of the right panel after generating one of these horoscopes.

Transit Horoscope

In the transit horoscope, the momentary influence of planets and other objects on a person from the native horoscope is determined. The transition of transiting objects through objects from the nativity, their mutual aspect, occurrence in houses, etc., are examined.

You can open the transit horoscope in the Sky Calendar by clicking on the **Transit** tab on the panel to the right or left of the horoscope.

Working with the controls on the right panel is more or less the same as in the native horoscope, in this case it is important to set the date for which the transits are to be calculated, or even the place if the person is located elsewhere than he was born (by clicking **Save as residence** button, which you will find on the right panel, you can set the current place of residence of the selected person).

Compared to the native and partner horoscopes, a section called **Events** has been added to the transit chart on the right panel, where it is possible to store moments of important (or even unimportant) life milestones of the examined person. Events stored in this way can then be easily reopened at any time in the future and displayed in the transit horoscope by selecting them in the list.

For the **Summary**, **Position** and **Aspects tables**, the same applies as has already been written for the native and partner horoscopes.

Next, we will briefly describe the function of searching for aspects beyond periods and secondary directions. Both of these features can be found in the panel to the left of the horoscope, in the Transit Horoscope section.

Aspects for time interval




This function searches for aspects of selected transit objects to selected objects of the native horoscope for the selected period. Those aspects that are set as active in the transit chart will be searched for (see the *Selection of aspect* button on the panel to the right of the horoscope, in the Transit Horoscope section).

In the window, select the transit and native objects whose aspects you want to find relative to each other, choose a period, and click OK. The result of the search will be displayed in a table that will show the starting and ending moments of each aspect found. By clicking on


any of them, the selected moment will be transferred to the transit chart.

Again, keep in mind that if you choose a period that is too long, the calculation may take longer.



Aspect charts

This function can be used to display a graph showing the position (angle) of the selected transiting planet to the selected object from the native horoscope. You start the function by clicking on the **Aspect charts** button, which can be found on the panel to the left of the horoscope drawing of the program's basic window, in the section of transit horoscopes.



First, select the transiting planet and the object from the native horoscope whose mutual aspects (angles) you wish to display in the chart. From the native objects, any one that is currently displayed in the native horoscope can be selected. Then choose the starting date of the calculation and the number of years for which the calculation should be performed. The maximum possible number of years of calculation varies for each transiting planet according to the speed of their movement, as follows:

- Month: Maximum 1 year (in this case it is a fixed value that cannot be changed).
- Sun, Mercury and Venus: Maximum 12 years.
- Mars: Maximum 24 years.
- Other planets: Maximum 100 years.

After clicking on the **OK** button, the calculation will be performed and a graph showing the changes in the relative position (angles) of the two selected objects during the selected time period will be displayed.

By clicking the mouse on the selected place in the chart, the selected moment is transferred to the transit horoscope drawing.

The graph can be saved as an image in JPG format.

Note: This function is mainly intended for quick and indicative detection of changes in the relative position of two objects over a longer period of time. If you are interested in the exact moments of the beginnings and endings of each aspect, use the *Aspects for time interval* function, which is described in the previous chapter.

Secondary direction (progression)



Secondary directions (progressions) are based on the assumption that one day after birth corresponds to one year of life. So, for example, if we want to find out what awaits a person in his twentieth year, we find out what position the planets (and other objects) were in on the twentieth day after his birth, and from their location and aspects to the planets native, we infer their influence.

In the window for setting secondary directions, you can choose for what year of life you want to calculate them, or you

can choose the exact date for which they are to be calculated. Immediately afterwards, the Sky calendar will display on the outer circumference of the horoscope the position of the planets corresponding to the specified number of years or date (i.e., if you specify that you want to calculate directions for the twentieth year of life, the position of the planets will be calculated for the moment twenty days after birth, and these directions are then valid from the date of the 20th birthday to the date of the 21st birthday).

Further work with secondary directions is the same as work with the transit horoscope.

Calculation of Ingres

Ingres are horoscopes that are calculated for the moment when the Sun enters one of the basic signs (i.e. the beginning of the seasons). Therefore, if it enters the sign of Aries or Libra, it is the horoscope of the equinox, if it enters the sign of Cancer or Capricorn, it is the horoscope of the solstice. These types of horoscopes are mainly used in mundane astrology.

Ingres calculation:

- Click on the **Ephemeris** button on the panel to the left of the horoscope, in the "Horoscope for here and now" section.
- Select the detailed ephemeris of the Sun, set the desired calculation period, and click OK.
- In the table, you will then find the transition of the Sun into a sign and click on it. Ingres will then be displayed in the main program window in the form of a native horoscope.

Note: Sometimes planetary ingres are also used, which are counted for the moments when a given planet enters a sign. You can also count these ingredients using the Sky Calendar, in a completely analogous way as described above (just have the ephemeris of the desired planet calculated and then look up in the table when it enters the relevant sign).



Lunar Phases Horoscope


In mundane astrology, the lunar phase horoscope is often used, which is calculated for the moment when the moon enters one of its four major phases. The New Moon Horoscope is used to make predictions for a period of about one month (until the next New Moon), the Full Moon horoscope is valid for about 14 days, and the Quarter horoscopes are valid for about a week.

Calculation of the lunar phase horoscope:

- Click on the Ephemeris button on the panel to the left of the "for here and now" horoscope.
- Select the detailed ephemeris of the Moon, set the desired calculation period, and click OK.
- In the table, you will then find the moments of the moon phases. If you click on any
 of them with the mouse, they will be displayed in the basic window of the program in
 the form of a native horoscope.



Aspect analysis




The function displays the progress of the selected aspect over time.

On the vertical axis is the orbis that both objects reach during the duration of the aspect, and on the horizontal axis is time. Orbis acquires values from zero (=exact aspect) to the maximum orbis valid for the given aspect and the objects involved in it (see chapter Setting orbis). From the image on the left, it is clear that a maximum orbis of 8° was set for the


quadrature of the Moon with Jupiter. In the lower left part of the graph, the moment of the beginning of the investigated aspect is indicated, and in the lower right, then the moment of its end. The yellow circle in the chart highlights the moment from the horoscope (in this case the moment of birth, for transiting horoscopes it would be the moment of transit). Using the slider located below the graph, it is possible to move in the graph and examine what values the aspect acquires at other times.

The picture shows the most common course of the aspect, when two planets (in our case, the Moon and Jupiter) move relative to each other at a roughly constant speed (that's why the graph is linear) and do not change their direction during the duration of the aspect. And since the yellow wheel is located to the left of the zero orbis position, it is obvious that this is an applying aspect (the aspect will only reach the zero orbis in the future). But it's not always so boring..."




Here is a case where Mercury and Uranus come into exact aspect three times during the duration of the trine. First, the faster Mercury catches up with the slower Uranus. After they reach the first zero orbis, they continue the same movement until the first "hill" (or rather "first maximum"), at which Mercury changes direction from direct to retrograde, which causes them to reach an exact trine again in time (the second zero orbis). But after the second "hill" Mercury changes

direction from retrograde back to direct, so that after a while they reach the third exact aspect again. And only after that is the trigon completed.




The next picture shows the opposite case: Venus and Jupiter are in a trine, but they only get closer to the zero orbis in their movement, because Mercury changes direction during the duration of the aspect, as a result of which, before they meet in an exact trine, they begin both planets move away from each other.



The last example may look a little mysterious: From the image on the left, it is clear that for the square of Venus and Saturn, the maximum orbis is set to 8° (which is the upper value of the vertical axis of the chart), but the chart only starts at an orbis equal to 7°. How is it possible? The reason is the so-called overlapping aspects. To discover the cause, you also need to know that in the Sky Calendar, the binovil (which is an 80° aspect) orbis of Venus with Saturn

is also set to 3°. Together, both orbis are 11° (8+3), but since the quadrature is only 10° (90-80) away from the binovil, there is always 1° in which, according to this setting, both planets are in both the quadrature and the binovil at the same time. If such a situation occurs, then the Sky Calendar will always favor the aspect that is closer (or whose orbis is smaller), which in this case is the binovil. And that is why it will show the maximum orbis of 7° in the graph for quadrature, because if the orbis is larger, it already considers such an aspect to be binovil. If you are not comfortable with this behavior, there are two possible solutions:



- 1. You can reduce the maximum orbis for individual aspects and objects so that they do not overlap each other. This can be done in **Orbis Setting**.
- 2. Or if you never use a certain aspect, you can disable it completely, which can be done by clicking on the **Selection of aspects** button in the main window of the program (to the right of the horoscope). If I go back to our example and disable the binovil, then the graph of the course of the considered

quadrature will look like you see in the picture, that is, it will include the entire range from zero to the maximum orbis, which is what we wanted to achieve.

And at the end of this chapter, a few technical notes:

- 1. Aspect analysis is not available for partner horoscopes (except for the combined horoscope, with which the program works in the same way as with the native horoscope).
- 2. In native horoscopes, aspect analysis also cannot be used for fast moving objects that circle the entire zodiac in one day (which are houses, Arabian parts, ASC, DSC, MC, IC and (anti)vertex). These aspects usually last only very briefly, on the order of minutes or their small tens.
- 3. For transiting horoscopes, only aspects of transiting objects to objects from the native horoscope can be analyzed, not vice versa.
- 4. If you run an analysis of a transiting star, please be aware that the calculation may take longer, as stars (due to their very slow motion) tend to be in aspect for several decades, so a longer period needs to be examined.

Astrological interpretations

The Sky calendar contains interpretations of several hundred basic constellations of native, partner and transit horoscopes. These interpretations are divided into three sets: One contains explanations in Czech, the second in Slovak, and the third in English. You can add other interpretations and even whole sets of them to the program (see below).




If you want to list the interpretations of a horoscope, click on the **Readings** button on the panel to the left of the horoscope. You can find it in all three types of horoscopes (native, partner and transit). In the window that then appears, you choose what you want to include in the listing (see the picture next to it, from which it is clear that only interpretations do not have to be listed there). If you check the **Insert horoscope chart** option, the horoscope will be inserted into the report exactly as it is displayed in the main program window. After clicking on the **Select interpretations set** button, you can choose from which set the individual interpretations will be listed. Confirm your selection by clicking OK. The report will appear in a regular text editor, the

operation of which probably does not need to be described.

A list of explanations can be saved in PDF, RTF format (e.g. for Word) or as HTML.

Note: When reading the interpretations of individual constellations, please be aware that each horoscope is a very complicated formation where everything is related to everything, so take the interpretations offered by this program only as a kind of hint "how it could be". The Sky Calendar program cannot replace the work of an experienced astrologer, so if you want a really serious astrological analysis of your horoscope, do not hesitate to contact an expert (unless it is you).

Editing astrological interpretations



You can start this function by clicking on the **Editing** button, which can be found on the top bar of the main program window.

Here you can correct, add or even delete individual interpretations of astrological constellations.

First, select which storefront set you want to work with, or click the **New set** button to create a new, empty storefront set to store your new storefronts. You can also repair the set (i.e., change its name and description) or delete it entirely. As a standard, the program comes with sets containing explanations in Czech, Slovak and English. You can use other, custom sets to, for example:

- 1. You can create new sets with some special types of interpretations, e.g. for medical, karmic, etc. astrology.
- 2. You can create special sets with interpretations sorted by their authors.
- 3. You can create interpretations for such astrological techniques whose interpretations are not included in the basic sets supplied with the program, e.g. for secondary directions, various revolutions, composite horoscope, etc.
- 4. And maybe you can think of other options...


After selecting the set in the upper right part of the window, choose which interpretations you want to edit (native, partner or transit) and set the desired constellation in the **Select constellation** section. If the interpretation of the selected constellation already exists in the selected set, you can correct (or delete) its text and title. If it does not exist and if you have chosen a meaningful assignment, you can enter the new interpretation by clicking on the **New reading** button. If you choose a constellation that makes no sense or that the Sky Calendar cannot work with, then this button will be inaccessible.

Below we will describe the types of constellations to which interpretations can be imposed in the Sky calendar:


For native horoscopes, these are:

1. Type of constellation **Object in sign and in house**:


For example, you can enter the constellation Moon in Aries as follows:



Moon in the 5th House:



Mars in Leo and at the same time in the 5th house:




2. Constellation Type **Object in Aspect with Another Object**:

Mercury trine Jupiter:



For this type of constellation, you can further specify the position of the two participating planets in more detail.

For example, for the constellation "Mercury in Leo and at the same time in the 6th house in trine with Jupiter in Virgo and at the same time in the 3rd house", the assignment would look like this:



Of course, such a detailed specification is not mandatory, but you can arbitrarily limit it to positions in signs or houses and their combinations.

When defining this type of constellation, always select the first object that is placed higher than the second object in the list, i.e. set e.g. The Sun in aspect with the Moon, not the Moon in aspect with the Sun.

It is also not possible to specify the mutual aspects of the house cusps, the aspects between ASC, DSC, IC and MC, between the Moon nodes (they are always in opposition) and between Vertex and Antivertex (they are also always in opposition) – these aspects are not included in the Sky Calendar in native horoscopes. And in the same way, for any type of horoscope, it is not possible to specify mutual aspects between the fixed stars (they are always the same in long periods of time, i.e. not very interesting).


For partner horoscopes, you can enter the following types of interpretations:

When entering interpretations of partner horoscopes, always first select the position of the objects of the second person, i.e. the one who is depicted in the horoscope on its outer edge, and only then (in the second row) the position of the objects of the first person.


Again, we will show you the individual options on examples:

1. Second Person Object in First Person House:

For example, you would enter the second-person Mercury in the 5th house of the first person as follows:




Or the cusp of the 8th house of the second person in the 5th house of the first person:




2. The second-person object in aspect with the first-person object:

E.g. Second-Person Chiron in sextile with First-Person Venus:




And similar to the native horoscope, you can further specify the position of both participating objects in more detail, e.g.:

Second Person Chiron in the 4th House in a sextile with First Person Venus in the 6th House:



In **transit horoscopes**, **interpretations** are given more or less in the same way as in partner horoscopes, only the objects of the other person are exchanged for transit objects.

For example, transiting Mars in opposition to native Mars would be defined as follows:



Numerology

This function performs a basic numerology calculation derived from the date and time of birth of a person's native horoscope. You can start it by clicking on the **Numerology** button, which is located on the panel to the left of the horoscope, in the Native Horoscope and Here and Here Horoscope section. The window that displays the results of numerology calculations will look like this:



And what do all these numbers mean?

Everything is best explained with a specific example. For example, let's assume the date of birth from the picture.

To obtain individual numerological data, it is first necessary to add the individual digits of the date of birth and continue the addition until we obtain a single-digit number (i.e. a number less than 10). In our case, it will look like this:

First, let's add 7+5+1+9+8+4=34

Since the result is not a single-digit number, we continue to add 3+4=7

The resulting number 7 is the so-called vibrational number (sometimes also called the life or fate number). According to numerology, the vibrations of this number have a fundamental and lifelong influence on a person. This number shows not only the forces by which a person is formed, but also the goal of his life.

For further calculations, we first sort all the digits of the date of birth and the individual subtotals in one row. So, in our case, we get the series: 751984347. Now let's find out how many times each digit is contained in this series. The digit 1 is there 1x, the digit 2 is not

even once, the digit 3 is 1x, the number 4 is 2x, and so on. We then plot these numbers on the numerological grid according to the following rules:

- The cells in the left column of the grid contain the numbers of digits 1, 2, and 3 sequentially from bottom to top.
- Each cell in the middle column of the grid contains the numbers of digits 4, 5, and 6 sequentially from bottom to top.
- And each cell in the right-hand grid column contains numbers of digits 7, 8, and 9 sequentially from bottom to top.

The grid is now filled in and we can make the sums of the individual columns and rows. As an example, I'll give you the sum of the middle row of our grid, which includes cells with a number of digits of 2, 5, and 8. In our case, the digit 2 is contained 0x, the digit 5 is 1x, and the digit 8 also occurs 1x.

The first total will look like this: 0x2+1x5+1x8=13.

Since the result is not a single-digit number, we do another sum: 1+3=4.

Therefore, the sum of the middle row of the grid is the number 4. Analogously, the sums of other rows and columns are performed, as well as the sums by diagonal (i.e. cells with the number of digits 1, 5, and 9 and cells with the number of digits 3, 5, and 7).

What is the significance of these totals?

The totals in the columns indicate what level and what success a person will achieve in each stage of life, with the left column telling about the period of childhood and youth (up to about 25 years of age), the middle column and middle age (from about 25 to 50 years of age) and the right column about old age (over 50 years).

The totals in the rows then indicate the maturity of the examined person at each level, with the lower row talking about the physical level, the middle row about the mental level and the highest row about the spiritual level.

The sum of the 1-5-9 diagonal speaks of the ascension of man (the way of Sky) and the sum of the diagonal 3-5-7 speaks of the descent of man (the path of hell).

In all these cases, of course, the minimum value is equal to zero and the maximum is nine.

In addition to these data, the program also calculates the day on which the person was born (and the corresponding number of the day and its planetary ruler) and the planetary hour of birth (and the ruler of this hour). However, to calculate the planetary hour, it is necessary to know the time of birth, so if this figure is not known, the calculation will not be made.

After clicking on the **Readings** button, the individual numerological readings will be listed. You can edit, add or delete these interpretations as you wish, which we will talk about in the next chapter.

Editing numerology readings


You can start editing numerology readings by clicking on the arrow next to the **Editing** button, which is located in the top bar of the main program window.

First, select whether you want to edit the interpretations of the vibrational numbers or the numbers in the numerology grid.

If you are going to edit the interpretation of the vibration number, select the desired number from the Number drop-down list. If you are going to edit interpretations of numbers in the numerological grid, you can also choose in the following drop-down list how many times the selected number is contained in the grid.

If the selected interpretation has already been saved, its text will appear in the edit field, where it can be changed as desired, including its title. Otherwise, you can click on the **New readings** button to create a new interpretation.

Click the **Delete reading** button to delete it from the database forever.



The Symbolism of Numbers 1 to 9

Number 1: Symbolizes God, who created everything out of nothing. One is the unity and primordial foundation of everything (just as there is a one in every number, so God dwells in all things). According to Chinese philosophy, the male yang principle is contained in odd numbers and the female yin principle is contained in even numbers. Only in one are the two principles at the same time in perfect unity. In Christianity, the number one symbolizes Christ, who was the unity of God and man. One also means initiation into a secret doctrine. Initiation is at the same time finding the way to one's inner self, so figuratively the number one also symbolizes the Self.

Number 2: With the number two, multiplicity begins. The symbol of this number is doubling and opposite, they are two unities opposed to each other (God – Devil, good – evil, day – night, man – woman, beginning – end, etc.). However, according to the Chinese idea, there is no absolute darkness or absolute day, in every yang there is already a yin germ and vice versa. The Greeks said that two have a beginning and an end, but they have no middle, and therefore stand between unity and multiplicity. In alchemy, the number two is symbolized by the figure of a hermaphrodite. This character suggests that the tension contained in the two requires relaxation and a finding of balance.

Number 3: Three cancels the tension of number two by finding the centre and balance. It is a particularly sacred and lucky number (it is not for nothing that they say: "third time's the charm"). It is a symbol of true unity, because every unity is in fact a trinity (beginning – middle – end, past – present – future, etc.). The troika is a reconciliation of two opposing principles. The one, divided into two, regains its harmony with the three and becomes recognizable.

Number 4: Symbolizes the visible world. By adding the first 4 numbers, we get the number 10, which symbolizes the world, because God (1) created the world out of nothing (0). According to the ancient Greeks, matter consists of four elements, there are 4 cardinal points, 4 seasons, etc. Physicality also appears in the four. The One that separates from the Other (2) appears in the Three, but it lacks clarity. It is only the number four that gives form to the pure spirit. The Holy Trinity is not of the material world, for it lacks the Virgin Mary. In Christianity, the number four also symbolizes salvation, as it represents the 4 arms of the cross.

Number 5: The number five is a contradictory number, because no matter how we divide it, we always get one even number and one odd number. It is the number of life, as it connects the masculine and feminine principles and forms the centre of the numerological grid. It is also the number of the fifth element, which flows through the four elements as an invisible substance. For the Pythagoreans, the number five was a symbol of marriage and spiritual perfection (2 souls and 2 bodies united by love). The symbol of the number five is the pentagram, which plays an important role in magic. It is a symbol of the world in miniature, which perfectly corresponds to the entire universe. Man as a microcosm is an image of the whole macrocosm, because if we draw a man in a circle, his 2 arms, 2 legs and head will form a pentagram.

Number 6: According to ancient Greek mathematicians, six is a perfect number because it is divisible by three numbers (1, 2, and 3), whose sum and product are again six. It is a symbol of the world as a whole and a symbol of perfection. God created the world in 6 days. Christ was crucified on the 6th day of the week and at the 6th hour. According to the Chinese, the Skys have 6 levels. For the Celts, 6 was a sacred number: the 3 days before and 3 days after the full moon were sacred. The number six is also a symbol of the human striving for perfection. Man longs to become God and become one with Him. However, since it can never achieve this goal, the number 6 is also a symbol of failure and stagnation.


Number 7: This number has significant symbolic value in almost all cultures. God, who manifests himself with the three, unites with the world (4) and gives rise to the seven. God created the world in six days, sanctified and blessed the seventh day. The 7 eyes of Jehovah are a symbol of omniscience. Wisdom built her house on 7 pillars. There were 7 steps leading to Solomon's Temple. There are 7 sacraments, 7 deadly sins and 7 virtues. If we add the series of numbers 1 to 7, we get the perfect number 28 (= the period of the Moon's orbit), which is why seven is also considered a symbol of time.

Number 8: If seven is a symbol of time, then eight represents eternity. It is a symbol of the transition from the earthly and time-dominated world to the eternal and divine world. Therefore, 8 is also a symbol of initiation. The initiated person stands here at the beginning of his spiritual development, which will culminate in the number nine. Since the eight can be divided into two equal halves (i.e. two fours) and since the four is a symbol of the world, the eight also symbolizes justice. However, the number eight is mainly a lucky number: In Noah's Ark, 8 people were saved, in Islam there are 8 Skys, the Buddhist religion knows eight paths leading to deliverance, ...

Number 9: It symbolizes the highest perfection, the highest knowledge, it is the symbol of the one who brings enlightenment.

Tibetan-Chinese horoscope

The function displays the traditional Chinese horoscope of the Tibetan lineage of a person from the native horoscope or the "for here and now" horoscope. Open it by clicking on the **Tibet / China** button on the panel to the left of the horoscope.



Under the tab Signs, you will find:

Earthly and Sky signs for the year, month, day and hour of birth. An earthly sign is always one of the 12 "animals" and a Sky sign is always only one of the five elements, each of which can be yin or yang (there are 10 Sky signs in total).

In the next row, you will find the sum of the yin and yang signs.

Yin and yang are two opposing and complementary forces that are omnipresent according to Chinese philosophy and that create the dynamics of the world and life. Yin signs are highlighted in pink in the table, yang signs in blue.

Yin symbolizes shadow, night, darkness, the north side of the mountain, the rain cloud, femininity, etc. It acts passively, darkly, sadly, centrifugally, i.e. from the centre to the universe.

Yang symbolizes light, day, sunshine, the south side of the mountain, clear sky, masculinity, etc. It acts actively, brightly, centripetally, i.e. from the cosmos to its centre.

The predominance of yin signs usually signals the ability to grow, passive acceptance, inward orientation, lack of spontaneity, inability to assert oneself, etc.

On the contrary, the predominance of yang signs symbolizes expansive energy, orientation outwards towards the world, spontaneity, self-assertion, low ability to empathize, etc.

The signs of the year and the moon represent the external world of the person concerned, they show how the person behaves in society, how he shows his feelings. The signs of the

day and the hour, on the other hand, represent the inner world of the person concerned, showing how the person perceives himself.

At the same time, the individual signs symbolize the main stages of human life: the sign of the year represents childhood, the sign of the month represents youth, the sign of the day represents adulthood and the sign of the hour of old age.

The next part of the table shows the relationships between the earth signs. It is a list of signs that interact qualitatively with each other, either positively or negatively (see below).

In the next table, labelled **Psychological and social characteristics**, you will find the assignment of individual "constellations" to one of the ten basic symbols of psychosocial characteristics, which embody certain frequently occurring human characteristics, situations or events. These "constellations" arise from the "dissolution" of individual earthly signs into one to three Sky signs (=coiled Sky signs of the 1st to 3rd order).

When assessing the importance of individual symbols in a particular horoscope, it is necessary to take into account not only how many times a certain symbol occurs in the horoscope, but also whether the symbol is supported or weakened by some other symbol also present in the horoscope. However, even those symbols that are not present in the horoscope at all have a certain importance, because even the absent aspects of human nature often say a lot.

In parentheses after the name of the individual symbols you will find their gross score (the greater the number of points, the greater the significance of the symbol in the given horoscope).

Relationships between earth signs

Harmonic connections (correspond to a trigon):

There are four trigons of signs that are in perfect harmony with each other and support each other. The presence of at least two signs (but preferably all three) from a trine in the horoscope is considered a very favourable constellation, because these signs cooperate together and multiply their strength. Each of the trigons supports a different area (competition, reason, autonomy or cooperation).

Fruitful connections (corresponding to quincunx):

These are beneficial connections. They play a role, especially in the field of love and relationships. They can be of two types: ascending (in the program they are indicated by an arrow pointing upwards) and descending (indicated by an arrow pointing downwards), with especially ascending ones being very favourable.

Strained relations (corresponding to the opposition):

They are created by a pair of signs that oppose each other, creating tension. They point to contradictory tendencies and obstacles. Both signs fight against each other and try to gain

dominance of one over the other. These signs are in constant conflict, and the person then behaves according to which sign has gained dominance at the moment.

Dissolver (sextile):

There is a constellation in which one sign moderates (dissolves) the qualities of another sign. For example, if sign A is in opposition to sign B, this opposition will be mitigated if A or B is also "dissolved" by another sign.

Retarder and accelerator (quadrature):

It is a combination of two signs in which the second sign speeds up or slows down the manifestations of the first sign. The relation of the accelerator is signalled in the program by an arrow pointing downwards, while the relation of the accelerator is indicated by an arrow pointing upwards.

Competitors (semi-sextile):

It is made up of two neighboring signs. This constellation weakens the two participating signs and puts them in competition and misunderstanding.

Sky Signs

Wood:

It brings mobility, freshness, creativity, gentleness, growth, transformation and gradual development.

People born during the Rule of Wood tend to be moral, self-assured, sensitive, cooperative, active, thoughtful and generous, but they often overestimate their strength and abilities or leave the work in progress for another without completing the previous one.

Wood with yang polarity is depicted as a powerful, masculine pine, yin wood as a pliable, flexible bamboo.

Fire:

It brings clarity, liveliness, vigour and outward activity, but also uncontrollability, which can be associated with violence, destruction, conflict and intolerance.

People born during the Reign of Fire tend to be self-confident, decisive, energetic, adventurous, original, creative, dynamic, courageous, with leadership tendencies, on the other hand, they can also be aggressive, selfish, overly ambitious, impatient and thoughtless.

Fire with yang polarity is usually depicted as lightning or as fire with high-pitching flames, yin fire as fire in a fireplace or, in modern times, as a red-hot stovetop.

Earth:

It brings stability, realism, peace and prosperity.

People born during the rule of the country are practical, solid, prudent, thrifty, objective, serious, persistent, although at the same time they can also be somewhat slow, dull, with little imagination. They tend to be great entrepreneurs.

The land with the polarity of yang is usually depicted as the top of a ploughed field, the land of yin as a valley, a plain or as an earthen vessel.

Metal:

It brings decisiveness, clarity, energy, but also rigidity, domineering, authoritativeness, and the inability to compromise.

People born during the reign of metal are uncompromising, resolute, unyielding, ambitious, ambitious, persistent, inspiring, but they can also be very stubborn, inadaptable, cold, with a tendency to luxury, wealth and power.

Metal with yang polarity is depicted as a weapon, yin metal as a bucket or kitchen cutlery.

Water:

It brings spirituality, contemplation, communication, intuition, sensitivity, depth, but also passivity.

People born during the rule of water are communicative, foresighted, sensitive, flexible, changeable, have the ability to influence others in a subtle way, but they are also excessively conciliatory, passive, unstable, and lack self-confidence.

Water with yang polarity is usually depicted as a wave or a stormy sea, yin water as a quiet stream or the calm surface of a lake or in a bowl.

Psycho-social characteristics

Promoter:

He is a helper or a friend who helps a man by his intercession and secures him in trouble. It strengthens and creates a strong personality and a strong character, bringing a kind of security and confidence to life. It also symbolizes harmony. However, too many Advocates in the horoscope can at the same time reduce the ability to act and the will to act, because the person in question begins to rely too much on outside help. This can further lead to some disorder in life.

The Promoter protects the Property, controls the Bureaucracy and strengthens the Stamp.

Hypocrite:

It symbolizes falsehood, a bad helper or a deceiver who only pretends to help. It is a negative symbol, but it can be turned into a positive realization that one must rely mainly on oneself. It often brings a loss, most often financial. Therefore, a person with a significant representation of this symbol in the horoscope directly encourages them to free themselves from the desire for material things and to realize their transience and deceptiveness.

The Hypocrite decreases the Surcharge and weakens the Stamp.

Artist:

It is a symbol of joy, love, fulfilment, satisfaction, living life fully, accepting myself as I really am. It is also a symbol of the small pleasures of everyday life and the ability to experience them joyfully. It is a positive symbol throughout. However, a larger amount of this symbol in the horoscope may indicate hedonism, intemperance and waste.

The Artist restricts the Corrupt Officer and reduces the influence of the Exact Officer.

Initiator:

It symbolizes revolt, rebellion, uprising, restlessness, impulse to act or excessive pondering. It challenges established norms and conventions, emphasizes the ability to assert oneself and build one's own order. Its presence in the horoscope increases the likelihood that the person will be able to build something new, e.g. their own company in practical life.

The Instigator attracts the Surcharge and the Property, restricts the Corrupt Official, and weakens the Stamp.

Donations:

It symbolizes gifts, whether in the form of money, favourable circumstances, or useful acquaintances, in short, something that comes as if by chance and without effort, something that favourably helps the current situation. The Donations generates financial profit and a reward for merit. However, it can also be a symptom of egoism, scheming, and a fickle nature.

The Donations strengthens the Hypocrite and the Instigator, increases the Donations, supports the Property and the Exact Officer, reduces the Bureaucracy and weakens the Stamp.

Property:

It symbolizes security, whether material and financial, as well as "intangible" in the form of one's own abilities, which can only generate material profit. It indicates a stable personality, often also inner balance and peace. However, too much Wealth in the horoscope can also mean too many abilities and talents – such a person is often excessively fragmented and unable to decide which abilities to use and which path to take. This state also brings peace, but in its negative form, i.e. in the form of stagnation.

Property weakens the Intercessor and the Stamp, strengthens the Instigator, the Donations and the Exact Officer, and reduces the Bureaucracy.

Corrupt Officer:

It symbolizes the weakening of order, limitations, obstacles and problems, manifesting itself in the form of adverse circumstances or diseases. Its positive way out can be to wake up from lethargy and channel the ego into the boundaries defined by it. However, it is extremely difficult to overcome it, and to suppress it requires two forces, the Artist and the Intercessor, who encourage the overcoming of difficulties or illnesses.

A corrupt official weakens the Artist and the Intercessor and diminishes the Property.

Exact Officer:

It symbolizes law, discipline, order, justice, security, and stability. It requires effort and exertion that leads the person concerned to self-improvement. In this sense, then, he is a kind of counterweight to the Paraclete. However, too strong a Punctual Official causes an unhealthy desire for stability and security and can even lead to inner wandering.

The Exact Officer controls the Intercessor and the Hypocrite, reduces the influence of the Artist, suppresses the Instigator, protects the Donations, takes away the Property, and weakens the Stamp.

Red tape:

It symbolizes obstinacy, rigidity and abuse of office (order) and power. Figuratively, it indicates how far the person in question is able to go if increased demands are placed on him, it signals abuse and disrespect for others.

It overcomes the Artist, suppresses the Architect, increases the Donations and the Property, and supports the **Exact Officer**.

Stamp:

It symbolizes praise, recognition, respect, esteem, promotes business and life progress. It is a positive sign of power, it also contains the principle of parental love and acceptance. However, if the Stamp is too strong, it can also mean excessive self-centeredness and the focus of all efforts only on the preservation of power.

The Stamp strengthens the Intercessor and the Punctual Officer, suppresses the Instigator, and increases the Donations and Property.

Firdaria



It is an ancient forecasting technique that is based on the assumption that human life is divided into several time periods, each ruled by a particular planet. The total duration of one cycle is 75 years, and the planets rule it for the following number of years:

- Sun 10 years
- Venus 8 years
- Mercury 13 years
- Month 9 years
- Saturn 11 years
- Jupiter 12 years old

- Mars 7 years
- Ascension Node 3 years
- Descending node 2 years


In the case of daytime births, the rulers of the individual periods alternate in the above order, in the case of night births, the Moon is the ruler of the first period, and the other planets follow in the same order, with the exception of the lunar nodes, which are placed either as the last in the series or (according to another system) after the planet Mars (in the Sky Calendar you will find a switch for these two options).

Each period, with the exception of those ruled by the Moon Nodes, is further divided into seven subperiods of equal length, the first of which is always ruled by the same planet that rules the entire period, and the others are then alternated again in the above order, with the Moon nodes omitted.

Firdaria are most often used in conjunction with the natal chart, where they can indicate in which part of life the influences of a certain planet will be most pronounced. It can also be useful to use them together with a solar revolution calculated for a certain age.

The **button** to calculate the Firdaria can be found in the panel on the left, in the Native Horoscope section.

Celtic Tree Horoscope




It is an ancient horoscope of the ancient Celts, according to which certain periods of the year were dedicated to certain trees. According to this horoscope, the year is divided into 40 periods of different lengths, which are dedicated to a total of 22 trees. Most trees rule in two seasons, roughly half of the year, separated from each other, only poplar rules in three seasons, and oak, olive, birch and beech each rule in one single day, which are the solstices and equinoxes.

The button to calculate the Celtic

horoscope can be found in the basic program window in the menu to the left of the native horoscope and the "for now and here" horoscope. After pressing it, the text of the horoscope is immediately displayed, i.e. to which tree the day on which the person from the native horoscope was born is dedicated, and what are the basic characteristics of people born under the rule of this tree.

You can save the horoscope text in PDF, RTF and TXT files.

In the lower part of the window, there is also a button for editing the interpretations of the characteristics of individual "tree" periods, after pressing which opens another window in which individual texts can be changed at will.



Biorhythms

According to the theory of biorhythms, important functions of the human organism are influenced by three independent cyclically repeating rhythms, the so-called biorhythms. These are:

- 1. **The physical biorhythm**, which is sometimes also called the male biorhythm. It takes place in 23-day cycles and affects the body's condition.
- 2. **Emotional biorhythm**, sometimes also referred to as feminine. It takes place in 28-day cycles and affects a person's emotionality.
- 3. **An intellectual biorhythm** that takes place in 33-day cycles and affects the reasoning abilities.

All three of these rhythms have their origin at the moment of birth. From this point on, each of them runs independently according to its length and determines when a person is at the top in a given area, when he is at the bottom and when he experiences his critical day. Each cycle is graphically depicted after a sine wave. As a rule, the positive phase of these sinusoids indicates a period of good condition, high energy and activity. A negative phase then indicates a period of decline and lower activity. The point at which the sine wave intersects the X-axis is a critical day, a period of shocks, crises and all sorts of dangers. The days before and after the critical day are semi-critical days.

Physical Cycle:

- **Plus phase:** The body is ready for increased physical exertion, intensive physical work, sports are possible. Physical activity strengthens the body.
- Minus phase: You need to rest, gather strength and just think about sports.
- **Critical day:** Increased fatigue, reduced resistance to disease, danger of deterioration of the condition of sick and elderly people, often injured. An unsuitable day for surgeries.

Emotional Cycle:


- 1. **Plus phase:** Period suitable for being in society, increased ability to communicate, collaborate and empathize.
- 2. **Minus phase:** Emotional depression, indifference, numbness.
- 3. **Critical day:** Moodiness, irritability, quarrelsomeness, depression, impulsiveness. Sometimes a tendency to commit suicide. It is recommended to limit social contact.

Intellectual cycle:

- **Plus phase:** High intellectual performance, a period suitable for important decisions, for studying, or for solving difficult tasks.
- **Minus phase:** Focus on less challenging tasks and reviewing what you learned in the plus phase.

 Critical day: Lack of concentration, restlessness, rashness, erroneous judgment, illconceived action.

In the Sky Calendar, you can start calculating biorhythms by clicking on the Biorhythms button, which can be found in the menu on the left for all types of horoscopes, except partner horoscopes.




In the table, the individual cycles are denoted by the abbreviations F (= physical cycle), E (= emotional cycle) and I (= intellectual cycle). Days when the cycle is in the positive phase are indicated by the symbol "+", days when the cycle is in the negative phase by the symbol "- ", critical days by the symbol "!!" and semi-critical by the symbol "!". The age of the chosen person is given in days.

To the right of the table, the individual cycles are displayed graphically (which cycles are to be displayed can be selected using the switches below the graph). At the same time, it is possible to choose how many days the biorhythms are to be calculated (the allowed range of calculations is 10 to 100 days) and from what date the calculation is to be performed (after opening the window, the date from the horoscope is always set).

A table can be saved as a PDF or XLS file, and a chart can be saved as an image in JPG format.

Tattvas

You can open the tattva feature by clicking on the **Tattvas** button, which you will find on the left panel next to all horoscopes except partner horoscopes. In the opened window, the beginnings of individual tattvas are written in the form of a table for the date from the horoscope:



The first tattva always begins at sunrise, and the effect of atmospheric refraction is not taken into account when calculating the sunrise, so the time determined in this way differs by a few minutes from the commonly stated values for the given day and place. Tattva ends its reign at the moment of the arrival of the next tattva. That tattva that ruled at the time of the person's birth is highlighted in blue in the table.

In the list **of First Tattvas**, you can choose the tattva with which the cycle of their rotation begins. According to different schools, the first tattva is most often Vayu or Akash.

With the **Tattev System switch**, you can choose two calculation methods:

- 1. **From the East:** In this case, the first tattva begins at sunrise and each one lasts 24 minutes. So, all 5 tattvas will take turns in 2 hours. A total of 60 tattvas take turns per day, each of them 12 times and each last 24 minutes.
- 2. **From East to West**: Here, too, the first tattva begins at sunrise, but the first 30 of them are day tattvas and the remaining 30-night tattvas. Thus, the thirtieth tattva ends at the moment of sunset. Each diurnal tattva lasts one-thirtieth of the length of the day, and each nocturnal tattva lasts one-thirtieth of the length of the night, so the day and night tattvas differ in their length (only at the equinox are they approximately the same or if you live on the equator). In total, however, there are 60 tattvas divided into 12 groups per day.

Whichever of the two systems is used, we always get a total of 12 groups of five tattvas each, the same number as the zodiac sign. Because the meaning and characteristics of the

individual groups are very similar to the meanings of the astrological signs, the symbols of the zodiac signs are used in the headers of the individual columns of the table.

Since it is essential to know the moment of sunrise in order to calculate tattvas, such a calculation cannot be made for places beyond the Arctic Circle when there is a polar day or polar night. Also, tattvas will not be counted for persons whose time of birth is unknown.

And the table can again be saved in PDF or XLS (Excel) format.

Properties of tattev

According to the ancient Indian sages, there are five elemental natures (tattvas) through which the cosmic energy of prana is manifested. They are:

- Vayu air
- Agni (Tejas) fire
- Prthivi (Bhuta) Land
- Apas (Jalo) water
- Akash ether

The rhythmic alternation of tattvas gives each moment very specific characteristics, which also has a significant influence on human actions. Thus, any activity and endeavour can achieve success only when it is carried out in harmony with cosmic energy.

Vayu tattva

People born under this tattva are very much in danger of life, they usually achieve their goals only at the cost of great sacrifices, but they tend to have mystical talents, they tend to be good psychologists, astrologers and poets. Their trust in their family is usually not great, they often change their place of residence and become travellers and adventurers.

During the Vayu Tattva, one should not initiate activities that are supposed to bring long-term benefits. Success can only be achieved in an activity that is to be brought to an end quickly. We only come to the authorities for negotiations if we do not care too much about the outcome of the negotiations. We do not start long journeys, but it is a good time to leave a place to which we do not want to return. In the same way, it is good to go to the monastery right now.

Dating for vayu tattva will not bring deep friendship or love relationship. This tattva favours only short-term and non-binding acquaintances. Likewise, marriages contracted at this time are usually short-lived. Sex for a vayu is usually just a physical experience and a means of drowning out boredom.

Agni tattva

People born under this fiery tattva tend to be impetuous, fierce, difficult to control and very combative. They usually do not have the ability to complete long-term work, but they are good advocates, warriors, researchers, pioneers, and advocates for the oppressed. They are not suitable for jobs that require perseverance, but they are successful when it is necessary to apply penetration.

This tattva favours quick and sudden decisions, but slow and hesitant people usually suffer defeat. It's a great time to radically change your life and bring to life ideas that are second to none. Artists have sudden and surprising ideas during the agni, and only later does it become clear how difficult or even impossible it is to realize them.

Agni tattva is not a good time to move, as it does not favour long-term intentions.

At this time, only people who are very militant should go to the authorities, the others only when the approval of the authorities is guaranteed.

We don't lend money for agni because it would be hard for us to find it. Similarly, the probability of losing things is increased under this tattva.

The love relationships made under Agni are wild, passionate, and fiery, but they soon fall apart.

It is a good time for eating and drinking, but not for drinking alcohol or other intoxicants. The fiery tattva burns food quickly, so eating at this time will not cause fattening. But if he is too thin, let him eat for the little tattvas.

Under agni tattva, great plans are usually made in families, but they cannot be realized. There are also outbursts of anger, quarrelsomeness, unjustified beatings of children, or fights. However, the anger provoked is short-lived, unless a murder is committed.

Agni tattva is not in favour of travel, but if you do set out on a journey at this time, disaster is likely to await you.

Pritvi tattva

People born behind the Tiny Tattvas are cheerful and optimistic, sometimes even naïve. They expect only benefits and successes from life. They don't have much ability to overcome obstacles, so they usually look for the easiest way to reach their goal. As a rule, they tend to be good and pragmatic entrepreneurs, bankers, goldsmiths, lawyers or civil servants. However, no revolutionary ideas can be expected from them, but they are unsurpassed in providing normal everyday duties. Women born under this tattva endow their surroundings with cheerfulness and happiness, they tend to have a well-developed body, but it is difficult to find much depth in them.

Earth Tattva brings joy, love, success and profit. Negotiations that are supposed to have long-term consequences will always be beneficial if they are initiated during this tattva, for the earth element is most favourable to any worldly enterprise. The money deposited during this time will yield high returns. This is a good time to start working hours, as people are in a cheerful mood right now. Everything that is to maintain lasting value should be started at the time of the pritvi Tattva. Likewise, dealing with the authorities is usually successful and entering a new home is a happy one. To build a house, lay its foundation stone right now.

Marriages contracted under the pritvi tattva are stable and rarely break up. Making love for the Earth Tattvas brings strength and relaxation. The agreements and arrangements made at this time will never bring the family to quarrels.

Those who are prone to fattening should not eat during the earthly tattva, although right now the craving for sweets and overeating are at their peak. Only those who are thin or who want to gain strength can eat even at the time of the pritvi tattva.

The Earth Tattva favours travelling, brings peace and quiet and protects against injuries. It also favors any purchases or sales. All entertainments, fairs, concerts and theatrical

performances should also begin during the holidays. If you are going to open a café, restaurant or other facility intended for relaxation, do it during the holidays.

Apas tattva

People born during this tattva are cheerful and optimistic to the point of naivety. They take adversity with fatal resignation, preferring not to perceive obstacles. They seek the pleasures and pleasures of life, they love to be caressed and cuddled, they like to be the centre of attention, they spread a good mood around them. They are ambitious, but they find it difficult to achieve their goals because their efforts are not backed up by adequate work. They tend to have artistic talent, but little managerial ability. They achieve recognition and success as actors, singers or painters, they can also be excellent healers or astrologers.

Apas tattva brings life's joys, love, merriment, success, financial gains. It brings success to all negotiations that are supposed to produce results in a short period of time. An agreement is much quicker and more open in apas tattva than it would have been at the time of pritvi tattva. If you want to get your matter resolved quickly at the office, start negotiations right now. While a fiery tattva would probably only bring discord and disagreement, a water tattva would certainly contribute to a mutual agreement.

The lovemaking initiated during the apas tattva will be pleasurable, intense and gentle as never before. Even fun and are best to start right now. Marriage contracted under water tattva is based on erotic attraction and it is difficult to tolerate the ordinary worries of life and lack of money. Such a marriage is suitable for artists or for people who are so secure that they no longer have to work. However, children and the worries associated with them tend to be a perfect disaster for these connections.

It is a good time for joint trips for entertainment, trips or visits to friends and relatives. Likewise, gardening or repairing the house should be started right now. Journeys that begin beyond the apas of the tattva can bring financial gain.

Akasha Tattva

People born during the Akasha Tattva tend to be sickly and their lives are often in danger. However, they can maintain their health through mental activity. They tend to be good priests, monks and philosophers, their judgment is clear and thorough. The future of these people is full of obstacles, they rarely achieve their goals. They usually do not have much property, and if they do not have any, they soon lose it. They often change their place of residence, even more often they have none.

Nothing is to be done during the Akasha Tattva except meditation and emptying the mind. Any other action is meaningless, for the Akash is indifferent to results, because emptiness reigns over it.

During this tattva it is not advisable to plan anything, it is not advisable to initiate any activity, it is not even good to think about it, because the realization of such ideas would probably end in failure. People you meet for the first time during the Akasha Tattva are not to be trusted, unless they talk to you about death or similar matters.

An application made to the authorities under the Akasha Tattva will bring misfortune. Do not make any other requests or requests during this tattva. The chances of them being heard are slim.

It is not recommended to travel during the Akash because of the risk of injury.

Love initiated during this tattva will bring misfortune or soon pass away. Even a marriage contracted at this time is not happy, it is affected by depression and melancholy. Lovemaking is usually followed by sadness.

Akash is the best time to meditate and pray, because nothing can be demanded of God at this time. Also, going to homelessness, going on a holy pilgrimage, or starting spiritual work or ministry should begin during the Akash.


Calculator

To open the calculator, click the **Calculator**, which can be found in the top bar of the main program window. The function allows two kinds of calculations with time variables:



1. Date and Time – Date and Time: Calculates the time difference between two moments and expresses the result in different units of time, which are the number of years, days, hours, and minutes that have elapsed in the period between the specified moments. This calculation can be used, for example, to determine age. For example, if someone was born on May 7, 1984, at 9:00 p.m., then at the time of their birthday in 2023, they would be exactly 20,511,360

seconds old, and the Earth would orbit the Sun 39.9987808 times during their lifetime (see note below).



2. **Date and Time ± X:** Adds or subtracts the desired number of years, days, hours, and minutes from the specified date and displays the result as a date and time. An example of use can again be the picture shown here, from which it is clear that a person born on 7.5.1984 at 21:00 should have a big celebration on 17.5.2022, because at 18:20 on this day he lives exactly 20 million minutes.

In most cases, the resulting moment can then be displayed either as a native horoscope or as a transit horoscope to the native chart that has just been opened.

Notes:


- 1. For both types of calculations, the year refers to the tropical year, the length of which is approximately 365.242 days. Therefore, it is not a calendar year, the use of which as a time unit would be problematic due to its unequal length (there are regular years, but also leap years).
- 2. Calculations can be made for dates between 1601 and 3000.

Birthday

This is a simple function that selects from a database of people those people who have a birthday on the selected day.

By clicking on the **Person Details** button, you can view the details of the selected person in the person database window.

And if you have the person's email address entered, then you can congratulate them by clicking on the **Send email** button.



Converting Dates from Version 4 of the Sky Calendar

This feature is intended for owners of the previous version 4 of the Sky calendar to convert the databases of people and interpretations to version 5.

To convert databases, do the following:

Open Settings (on the top bar of the main program window) and **on the Program** tab, click on the **Data transfer from version 4 of the Sky calendar**.

In the new window, first click on the **Find Folder with version 4 of the Sky Calendar**. Once you have found this folder, click on the **personal.dbm** file in the folder to confirm it. Then tick what you want to transfer: You can choose from a database of people and a database of places linked to it, as well as storefronts (if you haven't made any changes to them, they don't need to be converted).

And finally, click on the **Transfer selected data** button.

Version 4 persons will be added to the existing Persons in version 5 of Sky's calendar.

If you also choose to convert the interpretations, then the interpretations from version 4 will replace all interpretations from version 5 that are supplied with the program (which applies to all types of interpretations – i.e. astrological, numerological, Celtic and degree symbolism).

At the same time, after the interpretations are converted, it will be necessary to restart the Sky Calendar to load the new databases into the program. If you are only converting the people database, you will not need to restart because the people from the previous version will be added immediately.




Transferring user data to another computer

Perhaps you have purchased a new computer and want to transfer to it the data (database of people, interpretations, etc.) that you have stored in the Sky Calendar on your old computer. This data is stored in five files:

- personal.dbm: Contains a database of people, places, states, and your program settings.
- texts.dbm: Contains astrological and numerological interpretations.
- kelt.dbm: Contains interpretations of the Celtic horoscope.
- lunar.dbm: Contains recommended lunar calendar activities for gardeners.
- color.dbm: Contains horoscope color settings.

In principle, after you have installed the Sky Calendar on your new computer in the usual way, you can copy these files from your old computer to your new computer.

You can find all of these files in the folder where you have Sky Calendar installed.
